100 Years Ago

The Centenary of the Laying of the Foundation Stone was celebrated last October but the actual Centenary of the Church will be marked in March 2015 as St Aidan's church was consecrated by the Bishop of Manchester on 24th March 1915. 100 years' ago TS Ullathorne of Selby would have been constructing the church to the design by the Architect, Temple Moore under the careful eye of the first Vicar, Revd Hartley Harrison and the founding church members. We now have a Heritage Group to research the church's history and our current project is concentrating on researching the members of the Parish who are commemorated on our War Memorial. We are hoping to create displays for Remembrance Day 1914 as part of the national commemoration of the Centenary of the First World War.
