**In July we provided food** for 310 clients (almost identical to June), giving out 3.7 tonnes of food (worth £6200). We did however receive 4.5 tonnes in July, a temporary boost of around half of that total coming from our weekend collection at Tesco early in the month without which we would again have been spending heavily on our core requirements.

However we need around £100,000 of food during a year to meet the need and it remains a source of wonder and amazement at the continuing generosity of Rochdale people - particularly the commitment of church goers to weekly giving both in food and money.

We are also grateful for the cereal donated by Kelloggs each month, and for the new partnership with Greggs the Bakers, who will be helping us with bread and rolls by the end of August.
