News from Rochdale Foodbank

Sadly, demand for our help remains stubbornly high at an average of 280 Clients a month for the first six months of the year although this is well below some of the periods of high demand in early 2014 when the average for the same period was 344. We received a very welcome boost from our collection weekend at Tesco where generous customers gave over one tonne of food the value of which Tesco will top-up by 20%. At present though (and although this fluctuates on an almost weekly basis) we are very short of Tinned Rice, Sponge puddings, Jam, Instant Mash, Tinned fruit and Custard. The current level of demand still requires a steady inflow of donated goods from our supporters around town and for this we continue to be profoundly grateful.
